

Certificate of Undergraduate Study in Writing for the Environment

The 12-hour Certificate of Undergraduate Study (CUGS) in Writing for the Environment offers the opportunity to combine knowledge about and advocacy for environmental issues with the reading, writing, and communication skills necessary for success in a variety of academic fields and professional careers. It will enable students to forge connections between the sciences, social sciences, humanities, and creative arts and nurture the skills they need to advocate for environmental issues that are important to them and their communities.

To fulfill the 12 hours for this CUGS, students must select six credits from the Writing Arts Bank:
